Old Business:

Phosphorus Ban Update – Dave Foerster: An advertisement was placed in the Harold Palladium education the public on the Phosphorus Ban county and statewide. The grant from Freshwater Future for Phosphorus education and outreach will be officially closed upon completion of the grant report.

New Business:

Celery Pond, South Haven: Celery Pond Advocates have several projects slated to improve the wetland qualities of the Celery Pond. JF New is working with the group to reduce the abundance of cattails and replace them with a better diversity of wetland species. The group is also looking for sponsors to help with phragmites removal. It was suggested that TRC could contribute \$1,000 toward their efforts. The board had several concerns: The area with the phragmites is on private property and the owners have not officially committed to the project. The proposed project type may be beyond TRC's goals and financial abilities. Subject was tabled pending future discussion.
